In 2011, Carroll County Focus on the Future and EDC partnered on a county-wide branding project to create a visual identity for the county and its communities. The new logo and brand represent our strong agricultural roots and heritage.

Carroll County is named for Charles Carroll, the last surviving signer of the Declaration of Independence. When Mr. Carroll signed the Declaration of Independence, which was an act of sedition, a fellow signer complained that there must be many people named Charles Carroll in the colonies. Mr. Carroll then went back to the desk of John Hancock and added "of Carrollton" beneath his name. Mr. Carroll was the only signer to give his name and address.

This history lesson serves to remind us that Mr. Carroll was proud of where he was from – and so should we. That is why the "of Carroll County" has been added to the new logos.

The Burlington Township Trustee's office is really excited to be able to offer something new and different for the Burlington community. Collaborating with the Carroll County Community Center in Flora, a children's Day Camp will be offered this summer at the Burlington Community Park. The township will sponsor the Day Camp at a reduced rate to Burlington Township residents and those who are active in the Burlington community. The Day Camp is for elementary students having completed Kindergarten through age 12. The Day Camp will begin June 3rd and run through August 9th. The regular camp fee is \$65 per week or \$15 per day. The Day Camp at Burlington will be \$30 per week or \$8 per day. The balance of the camp fee is paid by the township. This is one way full advantage can be taken of the facilities at the

park. At the Burlington Volunteer Fire Department, we look forward to our annual fund raisers. Coming up April 13th this year is our annual Pancake and Sausage breakfast. 6:00 A.M. until noon. We look forward to seeing you there and as always appreciate your support. For our annual raffle at the Fall Festival we will be giving away a vacation package as a grand prize. Details have not been worked out completely yet, but the winner will have the option of adding more money to the package and they can pick when and where they use the package. So we look forward to that as well.

On another note, we have been blessed by the joint efforts of

our Burlington Township Trustee and the Burlington Town Council, to allow us to replace our complete air pack inventory. The air packs we had were purchased in 1998 through an Eli Lilly Grant at no cost to us. Unfortunately, this grant from Eli Lilly is no longer available. So we asked the aforementioned people to supply the money to purchase new air packs and they graciously fulfilled that request.

As a department that believes very strongly in the training of its members, we have decided to donate our used air packs to Twin Lakes High School where one of our newest

members is a student of the Fire Science Program. Currently the students enrolled in this program have to bring an air pack from the fire department they belong too, if they belong to one, or they have to share with one another. The Burlington Fire Department is donating 9 working air packs (SCBA's) or Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, to the Twin Lakes High School program to enhance the students learning experience in the classroom. This will help ready these young men and women as they prepare to pursue a career in firefighting.



Six years ago, organizations and individuals in the Burlington Community met with an attempt to better communicate with one another and the community. Out of that came the community newsletter. Hopefully, it has served the purpose of better communications. Another goal was to connect individual pieces to one another to make a complete puzzle. Burlington Community Park Board

The Burlington Community Park Board is an appointed group of volunteers from both the town and township. Please note that the Park Board has responsibility of overseeing and maintaining the Park grounds. However the Community Club has responsibility for renting the community building and the Lilly building while the Junior League is responsible for scheduling/renting the baseball diamonds.

Plans for the 2013 calendar year include replacing the timer for the lights on the walking path, light timer for the Kirkendall

and Mathews pavilions, replace the doors on the concession building, repair and/or replace the net apparatus on the tennis court, consider paving a path between the Little League diamond and the Pony League diamond., paving the road between the Pony League diamond and the Girls diamond, expanding the PA system as well as the normal maintenance of the park. Additional projects may include: replace AC units for the community building, replace electric water heaters with quick recovery gas water heaters, plan for the annual fall lawn

treatment., east diamond backstop replacement, and community building kitchen cabinet replacement.

The restoration of township cemeteries will continue this summer. Plans are that additional tombstones will be cleaned and repaired in the Hyde Park Cemetery located at the corner of 300 E and 800 S. The plan is to continue this restoration project over the next few years as funds are available. This work is done by the Graveyard Groomer company which is a small company from southern Indiana who takes pride in the work completed on these old tombstones.

Another consideration is being given to contract with the Carroll County Adult Education program to assist any individuals in the community who did not received their high school diploma. This would allow them to work for and receive a General Education Diploma. If any are interested, please contact the Burlington Township Trustee, Al Jackson, 566-2196.

Finally, there has been discussion about the need to support the Carroll County Senior & Family Services.
